St John's College, Cardiff is a leading co-educational Catholic independent day school for over 525 pupils aged 3-18. The school is housed in a beautiful Grade II listed building, developed to offer superb modern facilities, with an exciting new Sixth Form centre five minutes' walk from the main campus. St John's College enjoys a national reputation for academic excellence, being consistently ranked for over two decades among the highest-achieving schools in the UK, as well as a rich and diverse co-curricular programme, and is immensely proud of its role as Choir School to Cardiff Metropolitan Cathedral Church of St. David, the seat of the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Cardiff-Menevia. It is one of only two Roman Catholic cathedral schools in the United Kingdom, the other being Westminster Cathedral School.

The success of St John's College is underpinned by its Roman Catholic heritage and familial community. While maintaining a strong Catholic identity, St John's welcomes pupils of all faiths and backgrounds.

The school seeks an exceptional leader with the appropriate blend of skills, talents, experience and values to become its next Headteacher. Candidate Brief

Brief for the position of Headteacher, St John's College, Cardiff.



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Background

St John's College is the leading co-educational Catholic Independent day school in Wales, providing an exceptional all-round education for approximately 530 pupils, aged 3-18 years. Its success is underpinned by its Roman Catholic heritage and familial community. While maintaining a strong Catholic ethos and identity, it welcomes pupils of all faiths and backgrounds.

The College is immensely proud of its outstanding musical reputation and strongly believes in music's ability to enrich academic learning. Founded in 1987, St John's reputation for academic achievement has grown as swiftly as the College. It enjoys a national reputation for academic excellence, being consistently ranked, for over two decades, among the highest-achieving schools in the UK. It has received many accolades. For example, in 2017 it was named Wales Independent Secondary School of the Year by The Sunday Times Parent Power supplement, in 2022 it was named Top Independent School in Wales for Academic Outcomes and in 2023 it was recognised by the Daily Telegraph as the sixth Best Value independent school in the UK.

St John's College enables every pupil to thrive in a familial community where, through aspiration and opportunity, each individual achieves the most from their potential. This is achieved by offering the highest quality academic programme coupled with an extensive co-curricular provision in an environment that nurtures and celebrates hard-work and challenge.

The late Dr. David Neville was the Founding Principal of St John's College which was regenerated from the foundations of the recently closed De La Salle prep school, previously run by the De La Salle Brothers to educate pupils from the local Roman Catholic community. Dr. Neville oversaw the growth of the College from a base of 85 pupils in a seven-room single-storey building to the thriving academic community which can now be found in its new setting, a listed nineteenth-century building developed to offer superb modern facilities. In 2018, an exciting Sixth Form centre was opened by The Right Honourable the Lord Mayor of Cardiff, five minutes' walk from the main campus. The College's outstanding success has thrived under the present Headteacher, Mr. Shaun Moody, who is retiring after 38 years at the College, as Headteacher since 2018.

Today, St John's College Infants and Junior Departments and the Senior School form a close-knit community. Together the schools aim to educate young people of talent and potential to the highest level as they move from school to university and beyond. St John's College pupils go on to Oxbridge and top Russell Group Universities as young men and women with the highest aspirations and values, well-equipped to meet and compete with their contemporaries from across the world.




One family, three stages of development

Early Years & Infants (Age 3-7)

The Early Years and Infants Department provides a caring and stimulating environment in which all pupils are able to take part in new and enriching experiences. Children are prepared for the next stage of their education within St John's College by building their reading, writing and numeracy skills, using traditional methods as well as modern technology. The educational experience is enriched through the use of iPads and touchscreen laptops, interactive whiteboards and access to internet-based learning aids

The Infants Department benefits from a Forest School set amongst a copse of trees where children sit to discuss their activities, observations and findings around a log circle in the College's beautiful grounds. Pupils are very enthusiastic about their regular trips to Forest School which enable them to broaden their knowledge of natural habitats, bird life and woodland creatures, such as squirrels and hedgehogs.






Cutdoors Forest School is where our Nursery and Infant children sit to discuss activities, observations and feelings around a log circle amongst the trees in our beautiful grounds.

Juniors (Age 8-11)

The warm, family atmosphere of St John's College is exemplified in the close-knit junior community. Bright and spacious classrooms in an outstanding new block offer rich and stimulating surroundings in which pupils can learn and grow, nurtured by well-qualified and highly-motivated staff. Each pupil is regarded as a unique individual with his or her own particular learning needs and every pupil's individual talents both inside and outside of the classroom are encouraged and developed. Opportunities for co-curricular development include the Cathedral Choir, instrumental tuition, a diverse sports programme and the annual junior drama production. This is a place where learning is fun and the pupils particularly enjoy reading, with a thriving Junior library, run by the pupils themselves.

Seniors (Age 8-11)

The Senior School at St John's College allows pupils to build on the knowledge, skills and understanding acquired during their early years, and prepares them for life beyond the classroom. The College prides itself on providing an atmosphere where pupils are encouraged to be good human beings; the values of care, kindness and compassion are at the core of all it does. Its pupils benefit from small class sizes and the dedicated staff's unwavering commitment to providing first class education in a family environment. They are nurtured and encouraged to develop their skills in a safe and supportive environment and to be the best they can be; as a result, its pupils achieve, on average, 1.5 grades higher at GCSE than they are predicted.










Academic Life

Since then St. John's College has been named Top Independent School in Wales for Academic Outcomes (2022) and the sixth Best Value Independent School in the UK (2023). According to The Times Good School Guide 2025 the College was the best performing school in Wales based on GCSE and A-Level results in 2024

St John's College is an unashamedly academic school and, within a non-selective context, seeks to challenge every pupil to achieve their intellectual potential. Through a range of innovative teaching methods, as well a traditional quest for high standards, critical thought and curiosity for learning, the College makes for a stimulating and interactive learning community. Excellent facilities including class sets of iPads and Chromebooks and an awareness of current educational thinking and best practice combine to enable pupils to develop in a 21st century learning environment where effort and achievement are recognised and applauded. One example of the success of this was seen when a student received recognition for her discovery of two asteroids and a nomination for the Women of the Year Awards.




St John's College achieves outstanding results in public examinations, consistently maintaining a leading position in the UK, with 74% A*/A, 94.5% A*/B at A-Level and 79.3% A*/A at GCSE in 2024. Its students benefit from outstanding UCAS support. The vast majority of pupils move on to higher education, most of whom go to the UK's top universities, including Oxford and Cambridge.

Music plays a central role in school life.


As the choir school to Cardiff Metropolitan Cathedral, St John's College provides girl and boy choristers (aged 8-18), choral scholars and lay clerks for weekly services at Cardiff Metropolitan Cathedral Church of St. David, the seat of the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Cardiff-Menevia.

The choir has given concerts at St David's Hall, Cardiff, performances at venues such as St Paul's Cathedral, Oxbridge Chapels, Westminster Cathedral, Westminster Abbey, Bruges and Ghent Cathedral, Brecon Cathedral and the Royal College of Music and Drama and undertaken concert tours continental Europe, performing at Notre Dame, Paris and Madrid El Escorial. It has also performed with the world-renowned consort The Tallis Scholars and alongside the Prague and Cardiff Philharmonic Orchestra, has developed an active programme of international choir collaboration, has performed in BBC Radio 4 broadcasts and has appeared in a major Hollywood film.

In 2022 one of the Choir's choristers was named runner-up in the prestigious BBC Songs of Praise Chorister of the Year competition.

The College's many instrumental ensembles include its award-winning Concert Orchestra, which has been a finalist in the Welsh Proms Schools Competition and





Co-Curricular

Every pupil has the opportunity to develop their individual talents through the College's thriving and inclusive extra-curricular programme, encourages pupils to engage in a broad and diverse range of activities beyond the classroom. Besides the encompasses exciting sports programme that everything from rugby and hockey to golf and basketball, there is ample opportunity for debating, drama and performance. The College has enjoyed notable successes in sport, chess and the performing arts.

The College provides outstanding sporting opportunities supported by first class indoor and outdoor facilities. It is proud of its newly built multipurpose sports hall as well as the school's extensive sports facilities[SD1] in nearby Began Road, which include full-size football, rugby and cricket pitches with an artificial all-weather wicket as well as athletics equipment. A state of the art pavilion complex was opened by The Right Honourable the Lord Mayor of Cardiff in May 2019.

St John's College has celebrated individual and team achievements across a wide range of sports. Recent highlights include the Under-14 cricket team reaching the semi-finals of the Cardiff and Vale Schools Cup and the Under-15 rugby team progressing to the semi-finals of the Cardiff Schools Cup. Pupils regularly compete in fixtures against local independent and state schools fostering a strong spirit of competition and camaraderie. A significant number of pupils have achieved representative honours at national and international level across a wide variety of sports including sailing, fencing, cricket and tennis.











Many pupils participate in LAMDA sessions working towards accredited qualifications in disciplines such as Acting, Musical Theatre and Public Speaking. These opportunities help build confidence, communication skills and performance ability. Recent results were outstanding with the first cohort of 16 pupils achieving 13 distinctions and 3 merits.



Dramatic achievements have included The Sound of Music, HMS Pinafore, The Amazing Maurice and his Educated Rodents, Trial by Jury, A Midsummer Night's Dream, Twelfth Night, Alice, the Musical, Beauty and the Beast, 'Pantastic', Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat and Little Shop of Horrors, whilst Sixth Formers have enjoyed notable success in the Oxford Union and Cambridge Union schools debating competitions, students have represented Wales at the ESU Public Speaking Final in London, have won the Rotary Youth Speaks Area Final on three occasions and have been successful in "Bar Mock Trials" competitions.



As a registered Duke of Edinburgh Award centre, the College supports pupils through all levels of the programme. Almost all students participate in and complete one or more of the Bronze, Silver and Gold awards.

The College has enjoyed remarkable success in national and international competitions in the F1 in Schools Global Engineering Challenge, with students representing the College at three World Finals in Abu Dhabi, Singapore and Silverstone, where Team Blackout achieved an exceptional second place on the podium.



The Role

The Headteacher of St John's College shall, subject to the direction of the Trustees, be responsible for the overall management, internal regulation, teaching and curriculum of the College.

• **Budget:** To maintain oversight of the annual financial budget for the College and its implementation. To delegate on appropriate responsibilities including the collection of tuition and other fees, maintenance of buildings and grounds, catering, housekeeping and related tasks.

External Engagement

- **Public relations:** To take a lead role in the College's marketing and public relations to ensure creative marketing communication strategies are in place.
- Visible: To act as a figurehead and be personally visible and involved in school events.
- Community: To enhance St John's position and reputation in the community.
- Admissions: To oversee the procedures for admission to the College.
- **Independent sector:** To respond to the local and wider external environment of the independent sector.
- **Stakeholders:** To engage regularly with parents, prospective parents, Trustees and others, in particular, the Archdiocese of Cardiff-Menevia.
